All the contents were provided by the Kāinga Whānau Ora partners including Te Reo Māori books, Matariki Activiy books, Lido passes, invitation to Wild Base (Esplanade) and Lollipops Playland passes. These packs are a trial, so if you have any ideas for future packs then please let us know.

MATARIKI

I ngā rā o mua, many iwi not all, looked to the guidance of Matariki.

The number of stars can differ between iwi narratives, but the common 9 whetū are known as; Matariki, Pōhutukawa, Tupuānuku, Tupuārangi, Waitī, Waitā, Waipunarangi, Ururangi, and Hiwa-i-te-rangi.

Māori believe that the appearance of Maṭariki in the morning sky in midwinter marks the Māori New Year, or Te Mātahi o te Tau.

Matariki is the star cluster that is widely known as Pleiades. Matariki is seen from all around the world, and has many names. Matariki derives from the phrase "Ngā Mata o te Ariki Tāwhirimātea," the eyes of the god Tāwhirimātea.

After one of Tāwhiri's whawhai, he was overcome with anger, which led him to pull out his eyes, crushed them in his hands and threw them on to the chest of his father which we now see, as the constellation -Matariki.


