SYSTEMS SQUAD: DEBT REDUCTION

The Systems Squad is focused on changing and challenging government processes to achieve whānau outcomes.

Debt Reduction seeks to support whānau to break the debt cycle and address debt with government agencies. We have whānau who are part of designing a solution to support this aim.



What's next: The Systems Squad consisting of whānau, Kaiwhakaaraara, IRD, MSD, Kāinga Ora, THINK Hauora, TPK, Justice and Corrections meets every 3 weeks.

What is a Squad?

Squads are working groups that develop opportunities and create solutions that are whanau led.

What are Awhi Packs?

Awhi Packs were co-designed by whānau to provide a resource when attending doctors or hospital appointments and when isolating at home for the purpose of entertaining our tamariki. All the contents were koha from Kāinga Whānau Ora partners including Lido passes, invitation to Wild Base (Esplanade) and Lollipops Playland passes.

What's next: We are looking at things that worked well and things that didn't. Having whanau on these Squads is important so if you are keen then let your Kaiwhakaaraara know.



TIAKI TAIAO SQUAD: AWESOME AUTUMN

Awesome Autumn (previously Spring Bling) was co-designed by whānau to reduce MSD debt incurred by hireage of skip bins and clearing out 'big items'. We have run 3 of these so far and if your neighbourhood is interested then please let your Kaiwhakaaraara know.

What's next: We are looking at what worked well and really want whanau to join the Squad and determine what will happen next with this opportunity.

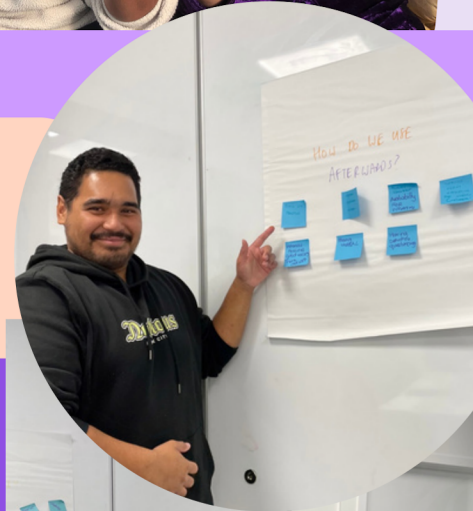
WHĀNAU WORKSHOP: BASELINE & WELLBEING SURVEY

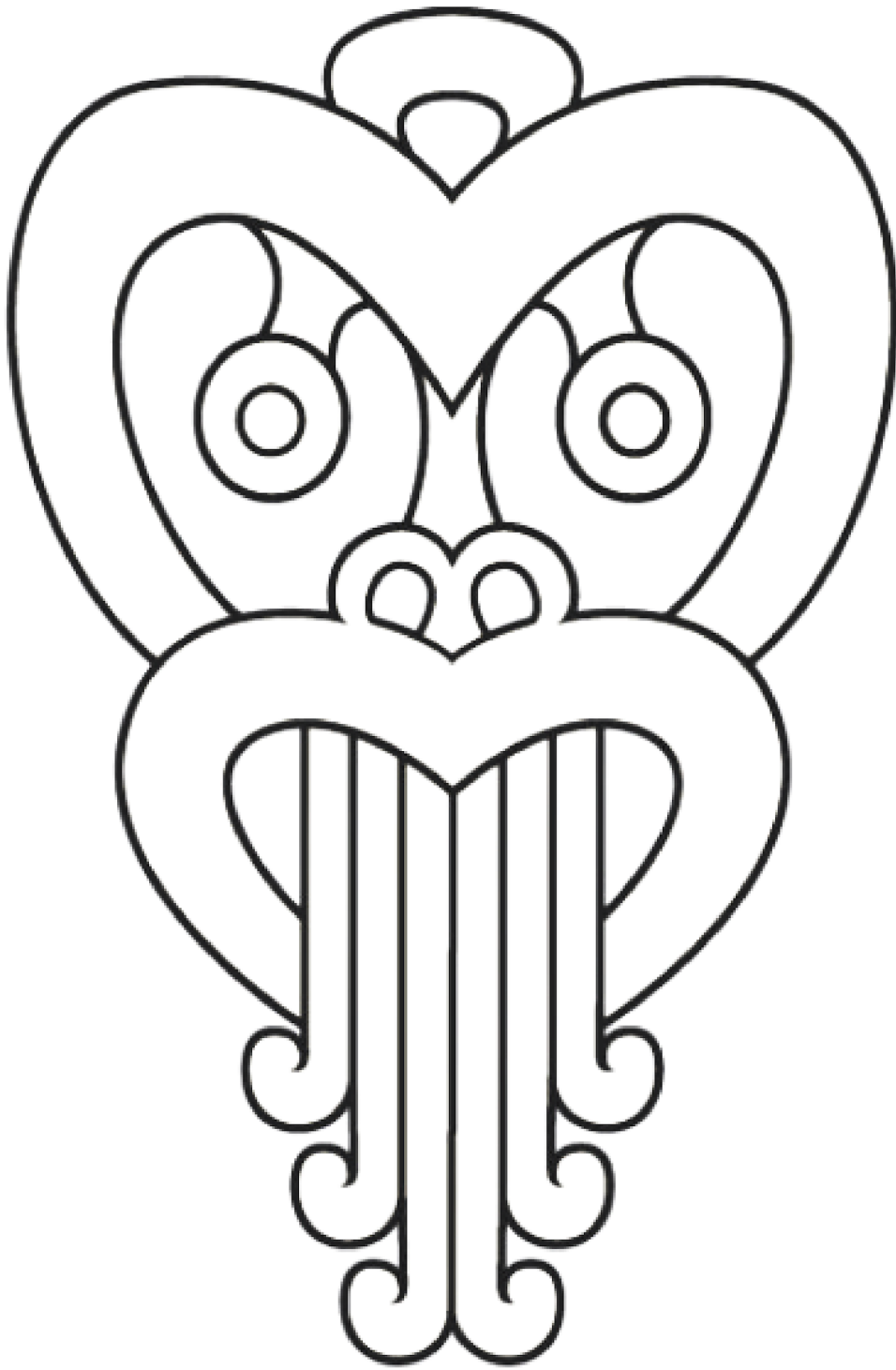
